Beats meet career opportunities: music festival energizes students and companies

- VDE organizes music festival for electronics, information technology and computer science at Stromwerk Dresden
- Innovative format brings students, prospective students and companies together to highlight career opportunities and counteract the shortage of skilled workers
- Numerous companies and universities help shape the program admission is free

(Frankfurt a. M., 28.05.2024) The starting signal is imminent: The Business Festival for Electronics, Information Technology and Computer Science will celebrate its premiere on June 7, 2024. Music meets career at "bits, bonding, bassline". Students will have the unique opportunity to make direct contact with leading companies in the technology sector in a relaxed atmosphere. The Stromwerk Dresden in Kraftwerk Mitte opens its doors for the event. The event is organized by the VDE. Dresden University of Technology (TUD), which already has many years of experience with similar festivals, is acting as a local supporter. Prof. Frank Ellinger from the TUD says: "Our experience has shown that technical content can be conveyed very well and effectively to the public by combining it with music, especially to young people." Other sponsors include various companies, universities and the city of Dresden. "At a time when the shortage of skilled workers is one of the greatest challenges, it is crucial to reach young talents in electrical engineering and information technology at an early stage, to inspire them and to show them exciting opportunities," says the initiator of the festival Dr. Damian Dudek, Managing Director of the Information Technology Society in the VDE (VDE ITG).

Electrifying experience: live music and career prospects

Just under 1,000 registrations from all over Germany already show just how much anticipation there is. Visitors can look forward to a varied program: various bands and DJs will be performing on stage, including the award-winning PARTYPROFs from TU Dresden – three



electrical engineers with a passion for music – and DJ Rob Lafête, who will be bringing the latest hits from the world of electronic music. In addition, companies offer a wide range of activities that promote exchange between students, prospective students and industry.

Numerous industry partners support the format and help shape the program. Universities and universities of applied sciences are also taking part in order to tackle the issue of recruiting young talent together. The special thing about the event is that admission is free. New ways of recruiting young talent

On the one hand, electrical engineering is the basis for numerous innovations and well-paid, secure jobs. On the other hand, studying electrical engineering is very demanding. While companies are desperately looking for young talent, 60 percent drop out of their studies in electrical engineering and information technology. The majority do so in the first semester, as a study by the VDE and the International Central Institute for Youth and Educational Television (IZI) shows.

The VDE wants to change this. "Young people want to shape the future – electrical engineering is a strong answer to this need. After all, electrical engineers are driving digitalization today, enabling electromobility and creating new opportunities for Industry 4.0," emphasizes Dr. Michael Schanz, Head of the VDE Technical Committee for Studies, Careers and Society. Inspiring young talent for technical professions is therefore essential to ensure the innovative strength and competitiveness of the industry. The festival should make it easier for them to access exciting career opportunities and be an inspiring platform for students and companies alike.
